

UHAND (University of Houston/MD Anderson Cancer Center) Program Mentor Guidelines for Writing Letters of Support (DOCTORAL STUDENTS ONLY)

To ensure that our program meets the highest standards in selecting UHAND scholars and to enhance the review process, we encourage potential mentors to use the following guidelines when writing a Letter of Support for your UHAND applicant.

- The letter should be 1) submitted on institutional letterhead, 2) signed by the mentor and 3) addressed to UHAND Directors, Drs. Shine Chang and Kayce Solari Williams
- <u>Descriptive subject line:</u> To identify your application, the subject line should include applicant name, fellowship and letter type. Example: Jane Doe, UHAND Scholar Letter of Recommendation.
- The letter should include the following components:
 - Brief description of the capacity you know the applicant and your thoughts on their potential for conducting cancer disparities research
 - Brief statement/paragraph about the proposed project and its relation to cancer disparities
 - Explanation of how this project could be part of or focus of a PhD Dissertation or postdoctoral research in cancer disparities
 - Statement of your commitment to training and mentoring the applicant during the entire fellowship period
 - Description of current mentoring capacity:
 - How many trainees at each level (undergraduate, predoctoral, postdoctoral) do you advise?
 - Description of the data and resources your lab has available to support the applicant's proposed research
